

Just a man, his guitar, his imagination and twelve terrific songs, can make for some wonderful musical moments, especially when the guitarist is **Vince Lewis**. His uncluttered approach to the music on *Jazz Musings* (Vince Lewis Music—4508) is refreshing and highly entertaining. Each note that he plays seems carefully considered, but they flow naturally and fluently. The songs are “Poor Butterfly,” “Nancy with The Laughing Face,” “I’m Glad There Is You,” “When I Fall in Love,” “I Remember You,” “Old Folks,” “A Quiet Thing,” “I’ve Grown Accustomed To Her Face,” “Stars Fell On Alabama,” “Polka Dots and Moonbeams,” “People” and “Serene,” all of them gems from *The Great American Songbook* except the last of them which is an original by Wes Montgomery. This is an album of sensitive and personal *Jazz Musings* that are ones that you will treasure.
